WHEREAS, the cornerstones of the School are strong Christian values, Catholic beliefs and traditions, and a spirit of cooperation. Qualified and experienced teachers are invested in the overall well-being of students, encouraging innovation, critical thinking, collaboration, and interaction, and above all, empathy and kindness; and

WHEREAS, since the School's founding in 1962, Saint Jude the Apostle has stayed true to its mission nurturing the formation of saints and scholars.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Russell K. Paul, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Sandy Springs, Georgia, and on behalf of the City Council, do hereby proclaim September 16, 2022 as Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School Day.

We are thrilled to be celebrating 60 years of academic excellence this 2022-23 school year! Serving students from kindergarten through eighth grade, our teachers average 15 years of teaching experience. As a twice recognized *National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence*, we offer a competitive academic program with a balance of core classes, STREAM, arts, physical education, grammar and handwriting, religion, and foreign language. In addition, we have a range of athletic and extracurricular activities, before and after school programs, field trips, service projects, and retreats.

### **Technology**

Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School recognizes the value of technology in the classroom to teach students how to develop and master skills needed for success. Technology represents the “T” in our STREAM model of learning. Students learn the importance of using technology to engage in the challenges facing our world. They are exposed to a variety of tools to aid in the implementation of the engineering design process.

Saint Jude School is a Google Apps for Education school. Every student in the school is issued their own device. Students in grades K and 1 each have an iPad. Students in grades 2-8 each have a Chromebook.

**In grades K-1**, students use their assigned iPad to access apps to complete tasks and projects that reinforce daily learning. Students will also use apps and programs

**pro**

to create their own authentic work, demonstrating knowledge and understanding of material presented.

**In grades 2-8**, students use their assigned Chromebook to access learning resources, class notes, individual and group projects, teacher communication, and other information. Students use their Chromebook throughout the day as needed for instruction in each subject area.

**All classrooms** contain an interactive LCD Projector/whiteboard that is connected to the teacher computer for viewing class materials and curriculum resources.

**In enrichment** classes, students will have use of their 1:1 device to enhance learning for these subject areas if needed for that lesson.

**Technology class** is scheduled once a week for all grade levels. Students complete STREAM activities that support learning, as well as build researching and coding skills.

### **Media Center**

Students meet weekly with our Media Specialist, Mrs. Straub who ignites our students’ passion for reading while teaching them how to use the online library catalog system and guide students in online

research. The Media Center is also equipped with a state-of-the-art broadcast studio. The student-led news crew delivers a *Morning Prayer* and *News Show* daily.

## STREAM Lab

Finishing our 3rd year in the Patty Childs STREAM lab, the students continued to boost their skills and confidence when facing any sort of challenge. They've excelled in coding and robotics, enhanced their abilities of collaborating and communicating with one another and had plenty of opportunities to show off their innovation and creative thinking. Using the engineering design process, they are able to identify problems, design possible solutions, test and evaluate those solutions until the best solution is discovered. The highlight of the year was when we incubated chicken eggs. This real

world experience allowed us to explore many different avenues that stemmed from this incredible process. The students learned how to care for the baby chicks, show compassion, and understand that "all creatures are brothers and sisters under God" (St. Francis).

# SJA serving our community

**Saint Jude students are well prepared when they leave our halls – both academically, and by leading with a servants’ heart to make a difference in our world. Serving others in our community is what we are called to do and our saints and scholars poured their hearts into these projects. We are thankful to all who supported us!**

## Kindergarten:

### **Toy Drive benefiting Lift Up Atlanta**

In December, our youngest students held a *Toy Drive* to support *Lift Up Atlanta*, an organization that provides homeless and low-income families in the metro Atlanta area safe housing, food, clothing, and other services designed to help them meet their basic needs and to empower them to reach self-sufficiency.

Lift Up Atlanta’s goal this year was to provide new toys to at least 600 children. The kindergarten Toy Drive was a huge success collecting over 400 toys. Our little ones certainly know how to spread some joy!

## 1st Grade:

### **Animal Shelter Drive**

In honor of Saint Francis Day, the first graders collected donations to support the *Atlanta Humane Society*. Over 85 boxes of Milk-Bones and treats, 242 dog toys and cat supplies, 14 collars and leashes, and gift cards were collected!

## 2nd Grade:

### **Our House Day Care Center**

In September, our 2nd graders promoted a school-wide *Diaper Drive* in partnership with *Our House*, a charitable organization in our community that provides day care and support for homeless families. Our House received more than 9,500 diapers and over 16,800 baby wipes, plus other much needed items for the homeless families they serve.

## 3rd Grade:

### **PruittPlace Retirement Home**

Our sweet 3rd grade students lifted the hearts and spirits of the residents at *PruittPlace* by singing their hearts out and bringing a few treats for them to enjoy.

## 4th Grade:

### **Men’s Homeless Shelter**

The 4th grade students provided 280 meal bags (breakfast, lunch, and dinner!) for men at *Central Night Presbyterian* and *Shrine of the Immaculate Conception* homeless shelters. The churches provide meals and a bed to homeless men of Atlanta.





## 5th Grade:

### **Community Assistance Center**

The 5th grade class sponsored a school-wide *Canned Food Drive* in March to help fill the shelves at the *Community Assistance Center (CAC)* in Sandy Springs. This year, they collected over 850 pounds of food to help stock the shelves at the CAC. The CAC supports individuals and families in need.

## 6th Grade:

### **The Sandwich Project**

In March, our 6th grade students worked in partnership with *The Sandwich Project (TSP)* and made 400 deli meat and cheese sandwiches to help TSP meet the food needs in Metro Atlanta. Students also made 400 homemade cards with a sweet note of encouragement.

## 7th Grade:

### **Solidarity Sandy Springs**

Our 7th grade students partnered with *Solidarity Sandy Springs* to assist local families in our community who are in need by providing food and helping them feel uplifted and supported.

## 8th Grade:

### **Catholic Relief Services**

While learning about refugees, the 8th graders partnered with *Catholic Relief Services* by donating baskets filled with household items along with basic essentials to assist with the refugee's transition.



## 8th Grade:

### **Daffodil Project**

The 8th grade took part in *The Daffodil Project*, which aspires to build a Living Holocaust Memorial by planting 1.5 million daffodils around the world in memory of the 1.5 million children who were murdered during the Holocaust. The first daffodils were planted in 2010; to date, over 600,000 have been planted worldwide. Our students contributed 500 daffodils to that count, planting them along the path of the Stations of the Cross between the rectory and school.

## Middle School Service Projects:

### **Christmas Clash: Mustard Seed Communities and Emory Winship Director's Fund**

The 8th Graders brought back the *Annual Christmas Clash Tournament* tradition of challenging the 7th Graders to a game of basketball. Through ticket sales, raffle tickets and concessions, the 8th graders raised \$1,026 benefiting the *Emory Winship Director's Fund*, to help combat cancer.

All Middle School homerooms joined in the clash by hosting a *Coin War* against each other raising over \$600 for the *Mustard Seed Communities*.

## Family Day of Service:

To kick-off *Catholic Schools Week* our 9th annual Family Day of Service supported the *Homeless at Heart* organization by delivering 176 kits to the homeless. Kits included: socks, winter hat, toothbrush kit, lip balm, disposable masks, hand sanitizer, snacks, and a handmade card.

# giving opportunities

**Annual Fund Giving** is a financial priority for our school. It is a tax-deductible opportunity for donors to help make a difference in the future of Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School. Gifts are unrestricted and added to the school's budget to meet current operating expenses, to enhance academic excellence in the classroom, and to support all programs and services offered to students. The Annual Fund allows Saint Jude School to successfully advance our mission of *nurturing the formation of saints and scholars!* Each family is asked to support the Annual Fund as our goal is 100% parent, faculty, and staff participation.

**Endowment Fund** giving is an opportunity to invest in the future of Saint Jude School and an excellent way to invest in the future of Catholic education. Contributions to the Endowment Fund are perpetual, and as the Endowment grows, so does the school's ability to carry on its mission. The Endowment Fund was established in 2002 to ensure the future financial stability of Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School. Memorial and honorary gifts can be allocated to the Endowment Fund at any time.

**Guardian Angel Fund**  
A donation to this fund provides a tax-deductible opportunity for donors and allows them to make a direct impact on a current student's ability to continue to pursue a Catholic education. Donors may provide full or partial tuition scholarships for a student or students in a family that demonstrates financial need.

**St. Martin Scholarship Fund** was established in 1996 to provide financial assistance for current Saint Jude School families who are experiencing an unexpected life crisis such as divorce, job loss, or death in the family.

**Emily Johnston Scholarship Fund** was established in 1988 by the Saint Jude Home and School Association in memory of Mrs. Emily Johnston, much-loved school librarian for 19 years. The fund provides tuition assistance to Saint Jude School families who demonstrate financial need.

## **Rob Paulinelli Memorial Award**

Rob Paulinelli attended Saint Jude in 7th and 8th grade and graduated in 1983. These two years were instrumental in establishing a strong friendship base for Rob going into high school. The Rob Paulinelli Memorial Award is given to a graduating 8th grade boy who is respectful, cooperative, a good friend, involved in athletics, a team player, always tries hard and is an all-around good kid.

**Elizabeth Huffner Angel Fund** was established in 2010 by Don Huffner in loving memory of his wife, Elizabeth, a former Saint Jude teacher. A scholarship is awarded each year to a current 5th grade student who possesses similar qualities as Elizabeth, particularly her love of literature.

**Elizabeth "Bitsy" Davis Memorial Scholarship Fund** was established in 2011 by Kathy Davis Pepe in loving memory of her daughter, Bitsy, who was a Saint Jude student and a graduate of Marist School. This scholarship is presented to a 5th grade girl, as Kathy taught 5th grade here at Saint Jude for over 20 years before joining administration. The recipient must possess an enthusiasm for living, be fun loving, yet a rule follower, a responsible student and exhibit kindness to everyone – all qualities Bitsy displayed during her life.

**Regina Hersey Memorial Scholarship Fund** was established in 2012 by Brian Hersey to honor his cherished wife, Regina. Regina made such an impact on the Saint Jude Community and was greatly admired by faculty, parents, and students. Her selflessness and dedication were so evident in all her endeavors. This scholarship is presented to a deserving student whose family is actively involved with the PTA and school community.

**Dr. Amy Bennett Bellows Book and Scholarship Award** was established in 2013 by Brent R. Bellows in loving memory of his treasured wife, Amy. Amy was the proud mother of Jack

and Will Bellows and was active in all aspects of their lives. Amy was also an avid Saint Jude School volunteer. Each year, a book and scholarship will be awarded to a 4th grade girl and boy committed to reading, achieving academic excellence, and loving God – all virtues Amy cherished, lived by, and strived to instill in her children each and every day.

**Liz and Bill Oliver Memorial Scholarship Award** was established in 2016 by long-time Saint Jude parishioner, Bill Oliver, to honor his beloved wife, Liz. This scholarship award is given annually to a current seventh grader who goes above and beyond his or her service hour requirements, and is, overall, a well-rounded student. As helping others was near and dear to Liz, this award was established to recognize a student who has made an impact in the community through dedicated service to others.

**Shane Matthew Connolly Memorial Scholarship Award** was established in loving memory of Shane Connolly in 2021 by his parents, Patrick and Annie Connolly, and his sisters, Lauren, and Maeve ('03). Shane was a former student at Saint Jude and a graduate of Marist School. The scholarship is awarded to a rising 8th grader, boy or girl, who demonstrates outstanding achievement both in the classroom and on the playing field, and who does so while emulating Shane's humility, unfailingly even-tempered sportsmanship, and consistently exhibited concern for and kindness to others.

**Christina Marie Wenke Memorial Scholarship Award** was established in 2021 by an anonymous Saint Jude School family together with Lisa Wenke, in loving memory of her daughter, Christina, who attended Saint Jude School from kindergarten through 8th grade. Christina was a ray of sunshine, appropriate as yellow was her favorite color! She was loving, kind, and compassionate. Beautiful both inside and out, Christina was not attention-seeking, yet had a sweet, spirited personality and radiated joy and happiness

to all. This scholarship will be awarded to a 5th grade student, boy or girl, whose quiet 'unsung hero' demeanor and contagious smile best exemplifies our angel, Christina.

**Germaine Baxter Memorial Teacher Scholarship** was established in honor of Germaine Florette Baxter (mother of Assistant Principal Josette Perez) in 2023. A devout Catholic, Germaine was born in St. Martin, New Brunswick, Canada and chose teaching elementary school as her career. She and her husband raised their family of five in Sandy Springs and were active members of Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic church for over 50 years. Germaine will always be remembered for her joie de vivre (joy of life), unfailing faith, quick wit, devotion to family, generosity to those less fortunate, and her strong morals and convictions. Germaine wanted to establish an annual scholarship of \$500.00 to an outstanding teacher at Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School.

**The Walter and Yvette Kisil Memorial Scholarship**  
This new scholarship was started by James and Tatiana Matthews, in loving memory of Tatiana's beloved parents. Walter's family fled communist Russia during the Cold War to practice their faith. Yvette was one of nine children, raised in a strict Catholic family, on a laborer's salary. Both were shining examples that faith, family, tradition, gratitude, accountability, and perseverance can lead you through any challenge and dreams can become reality. This scholarship will be awarded to a 7th grade boy or girl who has shown tenacity, grit, fortitude, and a belief that "when the going gets tough, the tough get going."


