profile

Founded in 1962, Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School is an extension of Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic Church. As a parish school, we work cooperatively with the church community to ensure the spiritual growth of our students. This relationship has proven to be successful in that our students demonstrate a willingness to serve God and others, and grow to become valuable members of society.

Serving students from kindergarten through eighth grade, our teachers average 15 years of teaching experience. The curriculum includes religion and all required elementary school subjects. In addition, computer, Spanish and French enrichment, physical education, chorus, art, drama, and band are offered.

Saint Jude recognizes the value of technology in the classroom as a teaching tool for our students to develop the skills and attributes they need to meet their current and future goals. Saint Jude is a *Google Apps for Education* school. Technology is utilized by students in the following ways:

In grades K – 2, a set of eight **iPads** can be found in each classroom. Students use them for learning centers or in combination with a cart of iPads so students can work in pairs or individually. The primary grades also have access to two carts of 30 Chromebooks to complete student work.

In grades 3 – 5, students have access to **iPads** and **Chromebooks** in the classroom to enhance learning, complete assignments, and create multimedia projects. Each grade has one iPad cart and one Chromebook cart.

6th, 7th, and 8th grade students take part in a **1:1 Chromebook program** where they access learning resources, class notes, teacher communication, and other information on a daily basis. Middle School students also have access to a cart of iPads for video production projects.

All classrooms contain an **interactive LCD Projector/whiteboard** that is connected to the teacher computer for viewing class materials and curriculum resources.

Enrichment classes such as foreign language, art, and music have access to a class set of iPads and Chromebooks for student use to augment these subject areas.

All grade levels attend the **Technology Lab** for weekly instruction to complete activities that support curriculum learning, as well as build researching and coding skills. Students take virtual field trips using Google Expedition (Google VR). Teachers may sign up for additional weekly time slots as needed for student project completion. The Tech Lab houses 34 Chromebooks and two 3-D printers.

The Media Center provides 40 Chromebooks for online student research and access to our library management system. The Media Center is also equipped with a state-of-the-art **broadcast studio**. The student-led news crew delivers Morning Prayer and a News Show daily.

Continue the **STEM certification process**



Thanks to our PTA who researched, planned, and scheduled a STEM-focused field trip for each grade this year! The goal of the STEM trips (known as STREAM here at Saint Jude, to include Art and Religion) was to align the experience with the curriculum or a “big event” for each grade. For example, the 4th grade holds an Invention Convention each year, so they enjoyed a design-related trip. These trips allowed students to understand that what they are learning has real-world applications.

STEM

Kindergarten had an in-house field trip with *Science Whiz*. They had a blast performing “Weird Science” experiments such as skewering a balloon and making lava lamps.

1st grade visited *Robotic Explorers*. They learned programming and built simple machines using Legos. The Robotic Explorer lab programs are the perfect environment for young students as they receive individualized teaching and gain the chance to practice collaboration and social skills. Students are able to design, build, code, and present their creations.

2nd grade visited Sky Zone for a *MathMind Workshop* where they formed hypotheses and performed experiments. This STEM-focused field trip also promoted a healthy, active lifestyle, as the students all had a chance to jump and enjoy a day of unforgettable flight!

3rd grade visited the *High Museum of Art*. This STEAM tour of the High allowed students to investigate the creativity and problem solving skills of artists.



4th grade went to the *Invention Lab at Georgia Tech*. This lab is run by and for GT students and includes everything from wood working tools to 3D printers. They also visited the *Museum of Design Atlanta* where they explored designs from around the world.

5th grade visited *Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport* to witness airport operations. They toured the E-tower and other areas that highlight what goes on behind the scenes to manage an airport. The highlight of the trip was boarding and touring a 767 aircraft.

6th grade went to the *Johns Creek Environmental Campus*. This state-of-the-art water treatment facility treats 15 million gallons of water per day. The students learned about the entire water treatment cycle and toured the facility.

7th grade toured *Mercedes-Benz Stadium*. This curriculum based STEAM tour highlighted the technology integrated into this new stadium.

8th grade took flight at *iFly Indoor Skydiving* facility. The STEM presentation aligned perfectly with the science curriculum and demonstrated physics in action using the wind tunnel. The day culminated with each student “flying” in the wind tunnel.

Benefiting our school's Endowment Fund, we raised \$26,614 – the most successful Endowment fundraising event to date! The March Madness themed event included a Corn Hole Tournament, delicious gourmet BBQ provided by Porter's Brew & Que, live music, and over \$5,000 in prize money!

In 2002, our Endowment Fund was established by a group of forward thinking staff and parents to ensure the future financial stability of Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School. Benefits of the Endowment Fund are perpetual, and once we reach our \$3 million goal, 4% of the balance will be given to the school annually to provide for **moderation in tuition increases**, support for our families by maintaining the **multi-child discount structure, tuition assistance**, and to support programs to enhance our ability to **attract and retain teachers**.

Our current balance is \$2.7 million! With the assistance of fundraising events like Spring Shindig, the generosity of Saint Jude supporters, and market returns, the endowment fund will begin to pay dividends to our community within a short time.

Atlanta Children's Shelter, Holiday House Toy Drive

Every December, our youngest students hold a *Toy Drive for The Atlanta Children's Shelter*. Their joy in helping others is evident, but their empathy is astounding considering they are only five and six years old. The Shelter provides free day care, emotional support, education for homeless children, and focused social services for their families.

1st and 8th grades

The Ronald McDonald House

Our 1st and 8th grade “buddies” collect books and create care packages for families at the local *Ronald McDonald House*. They understand the mission of Ronald McDonald Charities is to assist families of hospitalized children, and their enthusiasm at being able to help is truly heart-warming.

2nd grade

Our House Day Care Center

Our 2nd graders promote a school-wide *Diaper Drive* each October. In addition to diapers, they collect other necessary items needed to meet the basic needs of infants and children. Donations are delivered to *Our House Day Care Center*, which provides day care and support for homeless families.

3th grade

Dogwood Forest (Assisted Living Center)

Every March, the 3rd grade classes bring joy to local seniors through interaction, song, and treats for Saint Patrick's Day. This is so well received that we regularly have residents calling to see when our students will return.

4th grade

Men's Homeless Shelter at Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and Central Presbyterian Church

During two separate visits in January and February, the 4th grade classes prepare and serve meals to the homeless. The impact of this service project stays with the students for a lifetime, and they return to school and home eager to share stories from their new “friends.” The churches provide meals and a bed to homeless men of Atlanta.

5th grade

Community Assistance Center (CAC)

The 5th grade class sponsors a school-wide *Canned Food Drive* in March to help fill the shelves at the *Community Assistance Center* in Sandy Springs. This year, they collected nearly 1000 pounds of food, which they bagged, loaded, delivered, sorted, and then shelved at the CAC. The workers could not say enough about the enthusiasm and respect shown by our students. CAC provides assistance to individuals and families in need.

6th grade

Atlanta Community Food Bank

Our 6th grade students visited the *Atlanta Community Food Bank Product Rescue Center*. When food needs to be inspected after it is donated, where does it go? To the Food Bank's Product Rescue Center! 6th grade students inspected, sorted, and packed donated food for the Center.

7th grade

The Ronald McDonald House

Our 7th graders went to *The Ronald McDonald House* where the students prepared, cooked, and served dinner for the families staying in the house. They also hosted a fun activity night with the children at the house, where they played games and organized arts and crafts.

8th grade

Daffodil Project

The 8th graders had a second project – *The Daffodil Project* – which aspires to build a Living Holocaust Memorial by planting 1.5 million daffodils around the world in memory of the 1.5 million children who were murdered during the Holocaust.

The first daffodils were planted in 2010; to date, over 470,000 have been planted worldwide. Our students contributed 500 daffodils to that count, planting them along the path of the Stations of the Cross between the rectory and school.

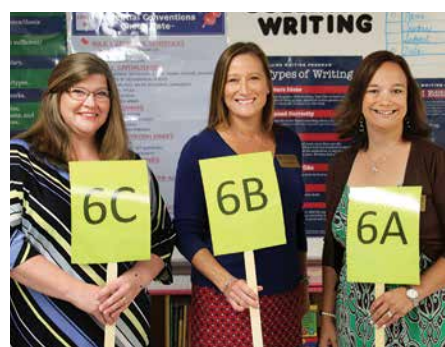
School-wide Service Project

During Catholic Schools Week and taking to heart the theme of the week, *Learn, Serve, Lead, Succeed*, our students worked together to pack more than 11,800 meals for *Rise Against Hunger*, an international relief organization that coordinates the distribution of food and other life-saving aid around the world. Our students packed enough meals to feed almost 70,000 people, primarily in schools and orphanages.

giving opportunities

Annual Fund giving is a financial priority for our school. It is a tax-deductible opportunity for donors to help make a difference in the future of Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School.

Gifts are unrestricted and added to the school's budget to meet current operating expenses, to enhance the programs and services offered to students, and to maintain the school building.

The Annual Fund offsets the difference between tuition and the actual cost to educate each student. Saint Jude does not receive a subsidy from either the parish or the Archdiocese of Atlanta. Each family is asked to contribute at a level appropriate for their financial situation. Our goal is 100% parent, faculty, and staff participation.

Endowment Fund giving is an opportunity to invest in the future of Saint Jude School and an excellent way to invest in the future of Catholic education. Benefits of the Endowment Fund are perpetual, and as the Endowment grows, so does the school's ability to carry on its mission.

The Endowment Fund was established in 2002 to ensure the future financial stability of Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School. Memorial and honorary gifts can be allocated to the Endowment Fund at any time.

Guardian Angel Fund A donation to this fund provides a tax-deductible opportunity for donors and allows them to make a direct impact on a current student's ability to continue to pursue a Catholic education. Donors may provide full or partial tuition scholarships for a student or students in a family that demonstrates financial need.

St. Martin Scholarship Fund was established in 1996 to provide financial assistance for current Saint Jude School families who are experiencing an unexpected life crisis such as divorce, job loss, or death in the family.

Emily Johnston Scholarship Fund was established in 1988 by the Saint Jude Home and School Association in memory of Mrs. Emily Johnston, much-loved school librarian for 19 years. The fund provides tuition assistance to Saint Jude School families who demonstrate financial need.

Elizabeth Huffner Angel Fund was established in 2010 by Don Huffner in loving memory of his wife, Elizabeth, a former Saint Jude teacher. A scholarship is awarded each year to a current 5th grade student who possesses similar qualities as Elizabeth, particularly her love of literature.

Elizabeth "Bitsy" Davis Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 2011 by Kathy Davis Pepe in loving memory of her daughter, Bitsy, who was a student at Saint Jude and a graduate of Marist High School. Kathy Davis Pepe taught 5th grade at Saint Jude for 20+ years and established this scholarship in Bitsy's memory to be presented to a 5th grade girl who displays enthusiasm for life, is fun-loving, yet a rule follower, and is kind to everyone – all qualities Bitsy displayed during her life.

Regina Hersey Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 2012 by Brian Hersey to honor his cherished wife, Regina. Regina made such an impact on the Saint Jude community and was greatly admired by faculty, parents, and students. Her selflessness and dedication were so evident in all

of her endeavors. This scholarship is presented to a deserving student whose family is actively involved with the PTA and school community.

Dr. Amy Bennett Bellows Book and Scholarship Award was established in 2013 by Brent R. Bellows in loving memory of his treasured wife, Amy. Amy was the proud mother of Jack and Will Bellows and was active in all aspects of their lives. Amy was also an avid Saint Jude School volunteer. Each year, a book and scholarship will be awarded to a 4th grade girl and boy committed to reading, achieving academic excellence, and loving God—all virtues Amy cherished, lived by, and strived to instill in her children each and every day.

Liz And Bill Oliver Memorial Scholarship Award was established in 2016 by long-time Saint Jude parishioner, Bill Oliver, to honor his beloved wife, Liz. This scholarship award is given annually to a current seventh grader who goes above and beyond his or her service hour requirements, and is, overall, a well-rounded student. As helping others was near and dear to Liz, this award was established to recognize a student who has made an impact in the community through dedicated service to others.


Dear Parents and Families,
