Founded in 1962, Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School is a welcoming, thriving, faith-based community of faculty and families working together to prepare students for not only higher education, but for life.

Serving students from Pre-K 4 through eighth grade, our teachers average 16 years of teaching experience. As a multiple National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence Awardee (2003, 2014, 2023), we offer a competitive academic program with a balance of core classes, STREAM, arts, physical education, grammar and handwriting, religion, and foreign language. In addition, we have a range of athletic and extracurricular activities, before and after school programs, field trips, service projects, and retreats.

Technology

Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School recognizes the value of technology in the classroom to teach students how to develop and master skills needed for success. Technology represents the “T” in our STREAM model of learning. Students learn the importance of using technology to engage in the challenges facing our world. They are exposed to a variety of tools to aid in the implementation of the engineering design process.

Saint Jude School is a Google Workspace for education fundamentals. Every student in the school is issued their own device. Students in grades Pre-K 4, K and 1st each have an iPad. Students in grades 2-8 each have a Chromebook.

In grades Pre-K 4-1, students use their assigned iPad to access apps to complete tasks and projects that reinforce daily learning. Students will also use apps and programs to create their own authentic work, demonstrating knowledge and understanding of material presented.

In grades 2-8, students use their assigned Chromebook to access learning resources, class notes, individual and group projects, teacher communication, and other information. Students use their Chromebook throughout the day as needed for instruction in each subject area.

All classrooms contain an interactive LCD Projector/whiteboard that is connected to the teacher computer for viewing class materials and curriculum resources.

Enrichment classes: Students will have use of their 1:1 device to enhance learning for these subject areas if needed for that lesson.

Technology class is scheduled once a week for all grade levels. Students complete STREAM activities that support learning, as well as build research and coding skills.

Media Center staff meet weekly with each homeroom to ignite a love for reading, instruct students on how to use the library management system, and guide students in online research. The Media Center is also equipped with a state-of-the-art broadcast studio. The student-led news crew delivers a *Morning Prayer* and *News Show* daily.

STREAM Lab

Finishing our 4th year in the Patty Childs STREAM lab, the students continued to boost their skills and confidence when facing any sort of challenge. They have excelled in coding and robotics, enhanced their abilities of collaborating and communicating with one another, and had plenty of opportunities to show off their innovation and creative thinking.

This was also the inaugural year of the Saint Jude Robotics Team, The JAGBOTS, who won the 1st Place Champions Award at the Cherokee County Fall Regional Robotics Tournament!

COGNIA STEM Certification

The school year finished strong when Saint Jude was recognized as a COGNIA STEM Certified School.



COGNIA STEM Certification identifies schools with high-quality STEM programs focused on engaging students in the process of learning, promoting deep thinking with clear connections to the outcome of learning while using integrated activities. Superintendent Mrs. Patty Childs said, "Achieving the COGNIA STEM Certification is a major accomplishment. It is an affirmation of the hard work and dedication of our teaching as they nurture our saints and scholars to be life-long learners and productive members of society. It also represents the amazing work of our students who willingly embrace thinking 'outside the box' to grow in knowledge and skill."

Men's Homeless Shelter

Our little ones made Valentine's Day Cards for all of the lunches the 4th graders made for the Men's Homeless Shelter!

Kindergarten

Lift Up Atlanta

In December, Kindergarten held a school-wide *Toy Drive* to support Atlanta's Children's Shelter, *Holiday House!* The shelter provides free, quality day care, emotional support, and educational curriculum for homeless children, and focused social services for their families. *Holiday House* is a “free” shopping event for homeless and formerly homeless families. The *Toy Drive* was a huge success, collecting over 425 toys.

1st Grade

Animal Shelter Drive

In honor of Saint Francis Day, the first graders collected donations to support the *Atlanta Humane Society*. Over 90 boxes of milk bones and 800+ other pet supplies were collected!



2nd Grade

Our House Day Care Center

In September, our second graders promoted a school-wide *Diaper Drive* in partnership with *Our House*, a charitable organization in our community that provides day care and support for homeless families. Our House received more than 9,200 diapers and over 15,500 baby wipes, plus other much-needed items for the homeless families they serve.

3rd Grade

Dogwood Forest Pruitt Place Retirement Home

Our sweet 3rd grade students lifted the hearts and spirits of the residents at *Dogwood Forest* home with a little Saint Patrick's Day Celebration filled with joyful songs and tasty treats for all to enjoy.

4th Grade

Men's Homeless Shelter

The 4th grade students provided 645 meals (breakfast, lunch, and dinner!) for 215 men at *Central Night Presbyterian* and *Shrine of the Immaculate Conception* homeless shelters. The churches provide meals and a bed to homeless men of Atlanta.



5th Grade

Community Assistance Center

The 5th grade class sponsored a school-wide *Canned Food Drive* in March to help fill the shelves at the *Community Assistance Center (CAC)* in Sandy Springs. This year, they collected over 700 pounds of food to help stock the shelves at the CAC. The CAC supports individuals and families in need.

6th Grade

The Sandwich Project

In March, our 6th grade students worked in partnership with *The Sandwich Project (TSP)* and made 400 deli meat and cheese sandwiches to help TSP meet the food scarcity needs in Metro Atlanta. Students also made 400 homemade cards with a sweet note of encouragement.

7th Grade

Tim Tebow Foundation "Night to Shine"

The 7th grade served as buddies to kids with disabilities to cheer on those attending the Tim Tebow Foundation's *Night to Shine*, a prom for individuals with disabilities. *Night to Shine* is a worldwide celebration event, centered on God's love, honoring and valuing people with special needs.

8th Grade

Ronald McDonald House

Eighth graders prepared and served dinner as well as led activities for the children and families staying at the *Ronald McDonald House*. Ronald McDonald House provides a place to stay for families who have hospitalized children.



8th Grade Daffodil Project

The 8th grade took part in *The Daffodil Project*, which aspires to build a Living Holocaust Memorial by planting 1.5 million daffodils around the world in memory of the 1.5 million children who were murdered during the Holocaust. Saint Jude parishioner and former school parent, Nida Mudd brought the Daffodil Project to Saint Jude over 10 years ago. Every year, 8th graders plant hundreds of daffodils on the Saint Jude campus. Over 5,500 have been planted on campus by students since 2003.



Middle School Service Projects:

Students assembled 140 kits for the following charities:

Mercy Care

Sixth graders put together meal kits for patients at *Mercy Care*. *Mercy Care* is an organization that provides quality health care for vulnerable communities. Over half of their patients are homeless.

Aurora On Wheels

Seventh graders assembled winter-theme activity kits for hospitalized children. Volunteers wheel a tie-dyed trunk filled with games and crafts around the hospital for patients to help bring some fun to their day!

Cure Childhood Cancer Organization

Eighth graders assembled snack bags for the *CURE Childhood Cancer Organization*. *CURE* provides snack bags to families during their appointments to help alleviate food costs, provide distraction, and uplift spirits.

Mustard Seed Communities and Childhood Cancer Foundation, Inc.

A Saint Jude tradition lives on...

Every year, 8th graders challenge the 7th graders to a game of basketball to support two charities. Through ticket sales, raffle tickets and concessions, the 8th graders raised over \$1,468 which was divided between *Mustard Seed* and the *Childhood Cancer Foundation*.

Greater Opportunities Access to Learning

Over the past three years, **293 donors** have supported **77 students** with **\$596,808** in scholarship funding which provides parents the opportunity for their children to receive a Catholic education. Saint Jude and the Archdiocese of Atlanta previously used the SSO – GRACE Scholars to provide scholarships for those in financial need. For 2025, the Archdiocese of Atlanta and Office of Catholic Schools will now partner with the Georgia GOAL Scholarship Program to offer this tax benefit to donors while they support Catholic Education.



The Georgia GOAL Scholarship Program is a remarkable initiative that enables individuals and businesses to help deserving students access quality Pre-K-12 Catholic education that may otherwise be out of reach.

All Georgia taxpayers are eligible to receive a 100% state income tax credit in exchange for their contributions to Georgia GOAL. Funds raised through GOAL are used to provide tuition assistance for exceptional students desiring to attend Saint Jude the Apostle Catholic School.

Tax credit limits based upon taxpayer filing status are as follows:

Single Filer	up to \$2,500
Married Separate Filer	up to \$2,500
Married Joint Filer	up to \$5,000
Individual Pass-Through Owner	up to \$25,000
C Corp, Trust, or Electing Pass-Through	up to 75% of annual tax liability

To secure your 2025 GOAL tax credit, submit an application and register before December 31, 2024. Register by visiting **www.goalscholarship.org**. GOAL will handle all remaining steps in the process until your contribution is due in mid-March 2025, within 60 days following approval by the Georgia Department of Revenue.
